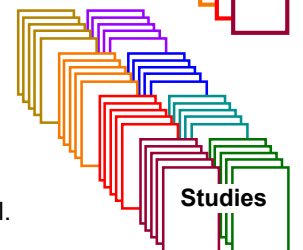

The Afterlife

God’s people will be given eternal life

[JUDE, TO BELIEVERS:] Keep yourselves in God’s love as you *wait for the Lord Jesus Christ with his mercy to give you life forever.*

JUDE 1:21 NCV™

There will be no more sorrow and no more death

He [God] will wipe away all tears from their eyes. There will be no more death, no more grief or crying or pain. The old things have disappeared. REVELATION 21:4 GNT

God’s people will be with God and Jesus Christ forever

[JOHN, DESCRIBING A VISION:] I heard a loud voice shout from the throne: *God’s home is now with his people. He will live with them, and they will be his own. Yes, God will make his home among his people.* REVELATION 21:3 CEV

[PAUL, TO BELIEVERS:] Then we who are alive and remain will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air. *And so we will be with the Lord forever.* 1 THESSALONIANS 4:17 ISV

11. God’s Promised Messiah

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The Old Testament Scriptures speak of a leader chosen and sent by God to save his people and to reign forever. This leader is known as the “Christ” or the “Messiah” – which are Greek and Hebrew terms respectively, meaning the “anointed” or the “Anointed One”.

In New Testament times the Jews looked forward to the Messiah’s coming – and many still do today. But the New Testament provides compelling evidence that this Messiah was in fact Jesus Christ.

Promise of a Messiah

Promise of a coming anointed one of God

[THE ARCHANGEL GABRIEL, TO DANIEL:] So know and understand: From the issuing of the command to restore and rebuild Jerusalem until an anointed one, a prince arrives, there will be a period of seven weeks and sixty-two weeks. DANIEL 9:25A NET

Promise that the anointed one would have God's Spirit

[THE COMING MESSIAH:] *The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to bring good news to the poor; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound; ...* ISAIAH 61:1 ESV

Promise that one would arise as a great ruler of Israel

[GOD:] As for you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, seemingly insignificant among the clans of Judah — from you a king will emerge who will rule over Israel on my behalf, one whose origins are in the distant past. MICAH 5:2 NET

Promise that he would bring God's salvation to the nations

[GOD, AS SPEAKING TO THE MESSIAH:] *I will make you a light for all nations to show people all over the world the way to be saved.* ISAIAH 49:6B NCV™

Prophecy of the Messiah's Death for Sins

The Messiah would die for people's sins, but then be raised

*But he was wounded for the wrong we did; he was crushed for the evil we did. The punishment, which made us well, was given to him, and we are healed because of his wounds. ...*¹⁰*But it was the LORD who decided to crush him and make him suffer. The LORD made his life a penalty offering, but he will still see his descendants and live a long life. He will complete the things the LORD wants him to do.*

The Final Judgment

On his return, Jesus Christ will judge and reward all people according to what they have done

For the Son of Man will come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then he will reward each person according to what he has done. MATTHEW 16:27 NET

Those who have believed in Jesus Christ will be saved

[A JAILER, TO PAUL AND SILAS:] *"What must I do to be saved?"*³¹*They replied, "Have faith in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved! This is also true for everyone who lives in your home."* ACTS 16:30B–31 CEV

Those who have rejected Christ will be condemned

The one who does not believe has been condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the one and only Son of God. JOHN 3:18B NET

This and the above subsections show that people will be judged according to their deeds and their response to Jesus Christ.

The ungodly will be thrown into fire

And Death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. *The lake of fire is the second death.*¹⁵*And anyone whose name was not found written in the book of life was thrown into the lake of fire.* REVELATION 20:14–15 NCV™

What people have known will be taken into account

For all who have sinned apart from the law will also perish apart from the law, and all who have sinned under the law will be judged by the law. ROMANS 2:12 ISV

Gentiles without knowledge of the Mosaic Law, by nature have a grasp of its requirements (cf. vv. 14–15) and will be judged as such (v. 12a). Those who know the law have a clearer understanding of what God requires, and so they will be judged more strictly (v. 12b).

Jesus Christ's Return

Jesus Christ will return at an unexpected time

You know very well that *the day the Lord comes again will be a surprise, like a thief that comes in the night.* ¹ THESSALONIANS 5:2 NCV™

No one knows when that day or hour will come—not the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father, ³⁷*because just as it was in the days of Noah, so it will be when the Son of Man [Jesus] comes.* ³⁸*In those days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage right up to the day when Noah went into the ark. ³⁹They were unaware of what was happening until the flood came and swept all of them away. That's how it will be when the Son of Man comes.* MATTHEW 24:36–39 ISV

Jesus Christ's return will be preceded by distressful events

And when you hear of wars and rebellions, do not be afraid. For these things must happen first, but the end will not come at once.” ¹⁰*Then he [Jesus] said to them, “Nation will rise up in arms against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. ¹¹There will be great earthquakes, and famines and plagues in various places, and there will be terrifying sights and great signs from heaven.* LUKE 21:9–11 NET

Awesome cosmic events will occur prior to Christ's return

Soon after the trouble of those days, *the sun will grow dark, the moon will no longer shine, the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers in space will be driven from their courses.* ³⁰*Then the sign of the Son of Man [Jesus] will appear in the sky* MATTHEW 24:29–30A GNT

Jesus Christ will return with his angels and in great glory

He will do this *when the Lord Jesus appears from heaven with his mighty angels, ...* ² THESSALONIANS 1:7B GNT

Then the Son of Man will be seen, coming in a cloud with great power and glory. LUKE 21:27 CEV

¹¹*“After his soul suffers many things, he will see life and be satisfied. My good servant will make many people right with God; he will carry away their sins.* ISAIAH 53:5, 10–11 NCV™

Verse 5 speaks of the Messiah's suffering for people's sins bringing them spiritual healing – effectively peace with God. Verse 10 appears to speak of God raising his messianic servant to life (following his death). The term “his descendants” (v. 10b) refers to the servant's spiritual descendants – those who would be given life through him. The resurrection of the Messiah is further spoken of in v. 11.

The Messiah's Identity

Jesus Christ is the one anointed by God, with the Holy Spirit

God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, and he went around doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, because God was with him. ACTS 10:38 ISV

The Holy Spirit coming down onto Jesus at his baptism (cf. Matthew 3:16–17) was God's anointing of Jesus for his mission. This also marked Jesus as the Messiah – the “Anointed One” – and fulfilled Old Testament (OT) prophecies that God would put his Spirit on the Messiah (cf. Isaiah 11:2; 42:1; 61:1). Jesus' remarkable ministry, in which he “went around doing good and healing”, was evidence of this and that God was with him.

The OT Scriptures show that Jesus is the Messiah, the Christ

For with his strong arguments he [Apollos] defeated the Jews in public debates by *proving from the Scriptures that Jesus is the Messiah.* ACTS 18:28 GNT

Jesus' deeds showed that he is the Messiah, the Christ

Jesus performed many other miracles that his disciples saw. Those miracles are not written in this book. ³¹But these miracles have been written so that you will believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and so that you will have life by believing in him. JOHN 20:30–31 GW

The Messiah's Mission

God sent Jesus Christ to take away sins

You know that *Christ came to take away sins.* 1 JOHN 3:5A CEV

As such, God sent Jesus Christ to save the world

God did not send his Son into the world to condemn its people. *He sent him to save them!* JOHN 3:17 CEV

Jesus Christ came as a human being

By *sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh* and concerning sin, he [God] condemned sin in the flesh, ... ROMANS 8:3B NET

God sent Jesus Christ “in a human body like ours” (NLT).

15. 'The Last Things'

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The history of the world as we know it will culminate in Jesus Christ's dramatic and awesome return. Associated with this is God's final judgment of all people. Afterwards the wonderful and everlasting life with God will begin, for those who are his people.

Who or what is the "Messiah" that the Old Testament Scriptures speak about?

Jesus Christ is now the high priest of God’s people, interceding for them before God in heaven

[THE WRITER, TO BELIEVERS:] *We have a high priest who sits on the right side of God’s throne in heaven. ²Our high priest serves in the Most Holy Place, the true place of worship that was made by God, not by humans.* HEBREWS 8:1–2 NCV™

[PAUL, TO BELIEVERS:] Christ died and was raised to life, and *now he is at God’s right side, speaking to him for us.* ROMANS 8:34B CEV

Other Key Aspects

The kingdom of God came in Jesus Christ’s mission

He [Jesus] said, “The right time has come. The kingdom of God is near. Change your hearts and lives and believe the Good News!”

MARK 1:15 NCV™

With Jesus’ mission, the time had come for the kingdom of God to come near. As such, a more far-reaching, spiritual dimension of God’s reign was established. It exists primarily in the hearts and minds of God’s people (cf. Luke 17:20b–21). Bear in mind that at the end of the age, God’s kingdom and authority will be fully imposed over all things.

God has made Jesus Christ Lord of all

You know the message he [God] sent to the people of Israel, proclaiming the Good News of peace through *Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all.* ACTS 10:36 GNT

Then God gave Christ the highest place and honored his name above all others. ¹⁰So at the name of Jesus everyone will bow down, those in heaven, on earth, and under the earth. ¹¹And to the glory of God the Father everyone will openly agree, “Jesus Christ is Lord!”

PHILIPPIANS 2:9–11 CEV

God has made Jesus Christ Lord of all things, to rule over all creation on God’s behalf. Note that vv. 10–11 above speak of all people in the future acknowledging Jesus Christ’s position as Lord. He also holds this position now.

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In carrying out his mission, Jesus Christ lived a life unparalleled in word and deed. His life culminated in his sacrificial death and subsequent resurrection. The Bible claims that our eternal destiny will be determined by how we respond to the New Testament’s testimony to these events.

Jesus Christ's Ministry

Jesus did the work God wanted him to do

[JESUS, SPEAKING OF GOD:] *He is the one who sent me, and I must finish the work that he gave me to do.* JOHN 4:34B CEV

Jesus did many miraculous deeds with God's power

God had given Jesus the power to heal the sick, ... LUKE 5:17B CEV

One night Nicodemus came to Jesus and said, "Teacher, we know you are a teacher sent from God, because *no one can do the miracles you do unless God is with him.*" JOHN 3:2 NCV™

Jesus preached the good news of the kingdom of God

Jesus went all over Galilee, teaching in the Jewish meeting places and *preaching the good news about God's kingdom.* He also healed every kind of disease and sickness. MATTHEW 4:23 CEV

Jesus' teaching was from God

[JESUS, TO HIS DISCIPLES:] I don't make up what you hear me say. *What I say comes from the Father who sent me.* JOHN 14:24B GW

Jesus Christ's Death

The Jewish religious authorities strongly opposed Jesus

Because Jesus was doing this on the Sabbath day, the Jews began to persecute him. ¹⁷But Jesus said to them, "My Father never stops working, and so I keep working, too." ¹⁸*This made the Jews try still harder to kill him.* They said, "First Jesus was breaking the law about the Sabbath day. Now he says that God is his own Father, making himself equal with God!" JOHN 5:16–18 NCV™

The Jews compelled the Romans to crucify Jesus

Pilate [the Roman governor] wanted to set Jesus free, so he spoke again to the crowds. ²¹But they kept shouting, "*Nail him to a cross! Nail him to a cross!*" ... ²³*The people kept on shouting as loud as*

A New Covenant

Through Christ believers have been released from the law

[PAUL, TO BELIEVERS:] And so *the Law was in charge of us until Christ came, in order that we might then be put right with God through faith.* ²⁵*Now that the time for faith is here, the Law is no longer in charge of us.* GALATIANS 3:24–25 GNT

The law was only ever to be the authority over God's people until Jesus Christ came, when faith would take its place as the way for God's people to be made righteous.

Note that the law's commands that are applicable either to the believer's new spiritual relationship with God or to their relationships with other people are still relevant. For they give guidance in how to please God.

The first covenant was inadequate and superseded by the superior new covenant – through Christ

But now, Jesus has been given priestly work which is superior to theirs [the priests' ministry], just as *the covenant which he arranged between God and his people is a better one, because it is based on promises of better things.* ⁷*If there had been nothing wrong with the first covenant, there would have been no need for a second one. ...* ¹³*By speaking of a new covenant, God has made the first one old; and anything that becomes old and worn out will soon disappear.*

HEBREWS 8:6–7, 13 GNT

The covenant which God made with Israel, based on the law, is often referred to as the first covenant or old covenant. It proved inadequate as Israel could not keep the covenant laws and so be righteous before God.

So God introduced a superior new covenant – through Jesus Christ, who is now the high priest of God's people (as per the following subsection). Under this new covenant, God's people have not only been released from the old covenant's law, God's laws in fact become internal principles for them, not just commands from an external source (cf. Hebrews 8:10). Additionally, God's people can be sure that their sins are truly forgiven (cf. Hebrews 8:12).

Righteousness by Faith and Grace

We are not made right by obeying the law – but by faith in Christ

For *no one is put right in God's sight by doing what the Law requires*; what the Law does is to make people know that they have sinned.

²¹But *now God's way of putting people right with himself has been revealed. It has nothing to do with law, even though the Law of Moses and the prophets gave their witness to it.* ²²*God puts people right through their faith in Jesus Christ.* ROMANS 3:20–22A GNT

The Israelites failed to keep God's law that he gave to them through Moses. Their experience showed that people are incapable of keeping the law. As such, we are unable to earn righteousness and be made right with God through the law.

But through Jesus Christ's death, God has provided a new way of righteousness through having faith in Jesus Christ. This involves believing Jesus Christ to be (with what he has accomplished) the means of righteousness – and accordingly trusting in him for one's own righteousness.

We are made right by God's grace, through Jesus Christ – not by law

[PAUL:] *I do not set aside the grace of God, for if righteousness comes through the law, then the Messiah died for nothing.* GALATIANS 2:21 ISV

God's grace is his free and undeserved favor to people. By God's grace we are granted righteousness through Jesus Christ's death for us – as opposed to earning righteousness through obeying the law. Otherwise Christ's death would have been pointless.

So, we are saved by God's grace rather than by what we do

For *by grace you are saved through faith, and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God;* ⁹*it is not from works, so that no one can boast.* EPHESIANS 2:8–9 NET

In this context, “works” refers to things one does to attempt to work for or earn righteousness and salvation – notably in trying to fulfill the law's demands.

they could for Jesus to be put to death. ²⁴*Finally, Pilate gave in.*

LUKE 23:20–21, 23–24 CEV

Pilate was trying to reason with crowds led by the Jewish religious authorities.

It was God's will that Jesus die – for everyone

[PETER, TO A CROWD OF LARGELY JEWS:] *In accordance with his own plan God had already decided that Jesus would be handed over to you; and you killed him by letting sinful men crucify him.* ACTS 2:23 GNT

God didn't spare his own Son but handed him over to death for all of us. ROMANS 8:32A GOD'S WORD®

Jesus Christ's Resurrection

God raised Jesus from the dead

But *God raised him from death, setting him free from its power, because it was impossible that death should hold him prisoner.*

ACTS 2:24 GNT

Jesus' body was not found in his tomb

[AN EARLY BELIEVER:] Some of the women from our group startled us. *They went to the tomb early this morning* ²³*and didn't find his body.*

They told us that they had seen angels who said that he's alive.

²⁴*Some of our men went to the tomb and found it empty, as the women had said, but they didn't see him.* LUKE 24:22–24 GW

Jesus appeared to people after his resurrection

After his death Jesus showed the apostles a lot of convincing evidence that he was alive. For 40 days he appeared to them and talked with them about the kingdom of God. ACTS 1:3 GW

Jesus Christ's Ascension

Jesus was taken up to God in heaven

They [two angels] said, “Why are you men from Galilee standing here and looking up into the sky? *Jesus has been taken to heaven. But he will come back in the same way that you have seen him go.*”

ACTS 1:11 CEV

God gave Jesus Christ great glory

He [Jesus] was humble and walked the path of obedience all the way to death—his death on the cross. ⁹*For this reason God raised him to the highest place above and gave him the name that is greater than any other name.* ¹⁰*And so, in honor of the name of Jesus all beings in heaven, on earth, and in the world below will fall on their knees,* ¹¹*and all will openly proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.* PHILIPPIANS 2:8–11 GNT

14. The New Order

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Through what Jesus Christ accomplished, God has established a new order in his relationship with the world. This chapter outlines the key aspects of this new order.

Is there anything you could do to better imitate Jesus' example of living a life focused on carrying out God's will?

What things about Jesus' life and teaching set him apart from other great teachers and their teaching?

What makes you think Jesus was raised from the dead? (The group could make a list of reasons which could be used in talking to someone who is skeptical about it.)

What did God do for Jesus following his death?

Can you see a link between being humble and obeying God (cf. Philippians 2:8)? If so, what?

How does Jesus Christ's death bring God's forgiveness of sins?

In what sense are we free from sin's control, through Jesus Christ's death?

Why is it so important that Jesus was raised from the dead?

Do you think that people can be saved only through Jesus Christ? Explain your reasoning.

How can simply believing (or having faith) in Jesus bring eternal life?

Salvation for the Gentiles

In OT times it was firstly only the Israelites, then after the Babylonian captivity more specifically the Jews, who were “God’s people” and as such knew the way of God’s salvation. But through Jesus Christ’s mission, God has made salvation open to the Gentiles.

God has provided salvation for the Gentiles through Christ

God did this [revealed his plan of salvation] because he wanted you Gentiles to understand his wonderful and glorious mystery. And the mystery is that Christ lives in you, and he is your hope of sharing in God’s glory. COLOSSIANS 1:27 CEV

God has made the way of faith in Jesus Christ open to Gentiles as well as Jews – there is no difference

God puts people right through their faith in Jesus Christ. God does this to all who believe in Christ, because there is no difference at all: ...³⁰God is one, and he will put the Jews right with himself on the basis of their faith, and will put the Gentiles right through their faith.

ROMANS 3:22, 30 GNT

13. Salvation through Jesus Christ

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The teachings in this chapter are at the absolute heart of the New Testament and the gospel message. It is critical for anyone trying to comprehend the Christian faith to soundly understand them.

Jesus Christ's Sacrifice for Us

Jesus Christ died as a sacrifice for our sins

We need a priest who doesn't have to bring daily sacrifices as those chief priests did. First they brought sacrifices for their own sins, and then they brought sacrifices for the sins of the people. *Jesus brought the sacrifice for the sins of the people once and for all when he sacrificed himself.* HEBREWS 7:27 GW

Jesus Christ died as a sacrifice to God for people's sin – "once and for all". His sacrifice is enough for the sins of all people. Now no more sacrifices need to be made.

So, Jesus Christ died for us

But God demonstrates his own love for us, in that *while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.* ROMANS 5:8 NET

Jesus Christ gave his life as a substitute for our lives. He died in our place to pay the penalty for our sin, so that we would not have to pay it ourselves with everlasting death. Instead we can have everlasting life. This is life which extends beyond physical death.

Note that as the Son of God, Jesus Christ's life is worth infinitely more than our lives, and so his death was an adequate sacrifice for any number of people.

Forgiveness of Sins through Jesus Christ

Jesus Christ's sacrifice means that our sins can be forgiven

But *Christ came only once and for all time at just the right time to take away all sin by sacrificing himself.*²⁷ Just as everyone must die once and be judged,²⁸ so *Christ was offered as a sacrifice one time to take away the sins of many people.* HEBREWS 9:26B–28A NCV™

[PAUL, TO BELIEVERS:] For *by the blood of Christ we are set free, that is, our sins are forgiven.* EPHESIANS 1:7B GNT

The mention of Jesus Christ's "blood" is a reference to his sacrificial death for us, by which we can be forgiven.

Through Jesus Christ's death we can be at peace with God

[PAUL, TO BELIEVERS:] You used to be far from God. Your thoughts made you his enemies, and you did evil things.²² But *his Son became a human and died. So God made peace with you, and now he lets you stand in his presence as people who are holy and faultless and innocent.* COLOSSIANS 1:21–22 CEV

Jesus Christ's resurrection was also crucial

Jesus was given to die for our sins, and *he was raised from the dead to make us right with God.* ROMANS 4:25 NCV™

Jesus Christ's resurrection was crucial for us to be made right with God – i.e. to be forgiven and at peace with him.

Salvation and Life through Jesus Christ

God provides salvation through Jesus Christ

[PAUL, TO BELIEVERS:] *God did not choose us to suffer his anger but to have salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ.* 1 THESSALONIANS 5:9 NCV™

We can only be saved through Jesus Christ

Salvation is to be found through him alone; in all the world there is no one else whom God has given who can save us. ACTS 4:12 GNT

Jesus replied, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father [God] except through me. JOHN 14:6 NET

The first statement most likely means that: Jesus is the way to God because he is the one who provides truth and spiritual life. The second statement clearly states that Jesus is the only way to God. This indicates that he is the only source of salvation.

Through Jesus Christ we can have eternal life

God loved the people of this world so much that he gave his only Son, so that *everyone who has faith in him will have eternal life and never really die. ...*³⁶ *Everyone who has faith in the Son has eternal life. But no one who rejects him will ever share in that life, and God will be angry with them forever.* JOHN 3:16, 36 CEV
