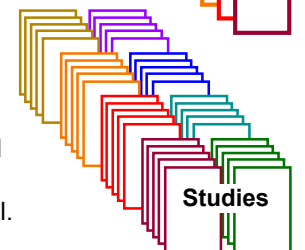
 **Concise Edition:** Key Bible teachings for new believers

Suggestions for Study Groups

Preliminary matters:

- Beforehand the leader should: check the context of any verses they are not familiar with; and review the questions. If need be, they should compose questions more applicable to the group.
- Each person should have a Bible, for things such as checking a verse's context. It would also be helpful to have Bible commentaries on hand.
- Pray before beginning the study. Ask God for help in understanding the meaning of the verses and to affect your lives through them. Also pray together at the end.

Doing the study:

- Ideally, read the material and answer the questions prior to the meeting. Then share answers and discuss any issues arising from the material in the meeting.
- Alternatively, read the material and answer the questions in the meeting – reading either aloud as a group or individually (prior to sharing answers). If reading as a group, **try having one person read the headings, another read the verses and another read the comments.** Additionally, a fourth person could read the Bible references.

General or concluding questions:

If time permits, conclude with one or more of the following questions:

- What is something that you either: **did not know** before; gained **greater insight** into; or **needed reminding** of?
- What verse would be helpful to memorize and bear in mind during the next week?
- In taking the verses seriously, is there anything you should change in:
 - (a) how you relate to God and/or to other people; or
 - (b) any other area of your life (e.g. attitudes, values or behavior)?
 If so, are there any specific steps you could take to do this?

State two or three key ways in which a leader should be an example for others to follow.

What things should a church leader do to strengthen members in the faith?

What can you do to encourage or help your church leaders?

Why is the Bible critical for Christian teaching?

How can we recognize false teachers and teaching?

Church Members' Duties to Leaders

Obey your leaders

[PAUL, TO CHURCH MEMBERS:] He has made us sure that *you are obeying what we taught you and that you will keep on obeying.*

2 THESSALONIANS 3:4 CEV

Give your leaders material support

Those who are being taught the Christian message should share all the good things they have with their teachers. GALATIANS 6:6 GNT

False Teachers

Watch out for false teachers

Be careful of false prophets. They come to you looking gentle like sheep, but they are really dangerous like wolves. MATTHEW 7:15 NCV™

Test teachers by comparing their teaching with the Scriptures

They [believers in Berea] were very willing to receive God's message, and every day *they carefully examined the Scriptures to see if what Paul said was true.* ACTS 17:11B GW

False teachers can be recognized by their "fruit"

You will recognize them by their fruit. Grapes are not gathered from thorns or figs from thistles, are they? ¹⁷In the same way, every good tree bears good fruit, but the bad tree bears bad fruit. MATTHEW 7:16–17 NET

As used here, "fruit" is that which one's inner being or character produces – basically one's words and actions. In a secondary sense, the effect of one's words and actions – particularly on other people – is also one's produce or "fruit".

26. Being One Body

Be One Body	2
Do Things Together	3

The New Testament deals extensively with how we should relate to other Christians and with issues vital for the life of the church. The topics in this chapter are amongst the most prominent themes.

Be One Body

Church members form one body – the body of Christ

[PAUL, TO THE CORINTHIAN CHURCH:] *A person's body is only one thing, but it has many parts. Though there are many parts to a body, all those parts make only one body. Christ is like that also. ...*²⁷ *Together you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of that body.* 1 CORINTHIANS 12:12, 27 NCV™

The term “the body of Christ” figuratively depicts the spiritual union of Jesus Christ with his people. Moreover, it points to the unity Jesus Christ’s people have together in their relationship with him.

While the worldwide church is the whole “body of Christ”, each local church is a form of “the body of Christ”. And in each case the many members together make one body.

Be united as one

Now the whole group of believers was one in heart and soul, and nobody called any of his possessions his own. Instead, they shared everything they owned. ACTS 4:32 ISV

[PAUL, TO THE CHURCH IN CORINTH:] *... be united by the same mind and purpose.* 1 CORINTHIANS 1:10 NET

In the last clause, Paul urges his readers to be united by having the same Christ-centered thinking and objective.

Be at peace with each other

[PAUL, TO THE CHURCH IN THESSALONICA:] *Be at peace among yourselves.* 1 THESSALONIANS 5:13B

[PAUL, TO THE CHURCH IN ROME:] Therefore, *let's keep on pursuing those things that bring peace* and that lead to building one another up. ROMANS 14:19 ISV

Submit to one another

[PAUL, TO THE CHURCH IN EPHEBUS:] *Submit yourselves to one another because of your reverence for Christ.* EPHESIANS 5:21 GNT

Be an example for others to follow

[PAUL, TO CHURCH MEMBERS:] *You know what you must do to imitate us. We lived a disciplined life among you.*⁸ *We didn't eat anyone's food without paying for it. Instead, we worked hard and struggled night and day in order not to be a burden to any of you.*⁹ It's not as though we didn't have a right to receive support. Rather, we wanted to set an example for you to follow. 2 THESSALONIANS 3:7–9 GW

Caring For Church Members

Pray for church members

[PAUL, TO CHURCH MEMBERS:] *We have not stopped praying for you since the first day we heard about you. In fact, we always pray that God will show you everything he wants you to do and that you may have all the wisdom and understanding that his Spirit gives.*

COLOSSIANS 1:9 CEV

Strengthen members in the faith

[PAUL, TO CHURCH MEMBERS:] You are our dear friends, and *everything we do is to make you stronger.* 2 CORINTHIANS 12:19B NCV™

Work hard at helping church members

[PAUL, SPEAKING TO CHURCH MEMBERS OF EPAPHRAS:] For I can testify that *he has worked hard for you and for those in Laodicea and Hierapolis.* COLOSSIANS 4:13 NET

Confront church members over sin

[GOD, TO EZEKIEL:] Son of man, *confront Jerusalem with her abominable practices ...* EZEKIEL 16:2 NET

Teach God's word to church members

Paul lived in Corinth for a year and a half and *taught the word of God to them.* ACTS 18:11 GW

Required Characteristics and Attitudes

Leaders must be godly

Church officials are in charge of God's work, and so they must also have a good reputation. They must not be bossy, quick-tempered, heavy drinkers, bullies, or dishonest in business. ⁸Instead, they must be friendly to strangers and enjoy doing good things. They must also be sensible, fair, pure, and self-controlled. TITUS 1:7–8 CEV

Leaders must be wise

[MOSES, TO THE ISRAELITES:] *Select wise and practical men, those known among your tribes, whom I may appoint as your leaders.* DEUTERONOMY 1:13 NET

Leaders must have a deep love for church members

[PAUL, TO CHURCH MEMBERS:] *Because of our love for you we were ready to share with you not only the Good News from God but even our own lives. You were so dear to us!* 1 THESSALONIANS 2:8 GNT

Leading the Church

Provide good leadership

Elders who provide effective leadership must be counted worthy of double honor, especially those who work hard in speaking and teaching. 1 TIMOTHY 5:17 NET

Be gentle and sparing in the use of authority

[PAUL, TO CHURCH MEMBERS:] *Instead, we were gentle among you, like a nursing mother tenderly caring for her own children.* 1 THESSALONIANS 2:7B ISV

[PAUL, TO CHURCH MEMBERS:] *For this reason, although in the Messiah I have complete freedom to order you to do what is proper, ⁹I prefer to make my appeal on the basis of love.* PHILEMON 1:8–9A ISV

Do Things Together

Meet together with other believers

Let us not give up the habit of meeting together, as some are doing. HEBREWS 10:25A GNT

Have fellowship together – and with God and Jesus Christ

[JOHN, TO BELIEVERS:] *What we have seen and heard we declare to you so that you, too, can have fellowship with us. Now this fellowship of ours is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus, the Messiah.*

1 JOHN 1:3 ISV

The concept of “fellowship” involves sharing and participating in a partnership concerning a common interest or purpose, which for believers is their faith and life in Christ. This is shown in the Greek word translated as “fellowship” (“koinonia”) which emphasizes participation. Believers participate in Christ and church activities, and in each other’s lives.

The above verse shows that the fellowship believers have together is not only based on their common relationship in Jesus Christ, but is also a fellowship with God, Christ and the Holy Spirit

Participate together in church activities

They [the disciples] gathered frequently to pray as a group, together with the women and with Mary the mother of Jesus and with his brothers. ACTS 1:14 GNT

[PAUL, TO THE CHURCH IN CORINTH:] *My friends, I ask you ¹⁶to obey leaders like them and to do the same for all others who work hard with you.* 1 CORINTHIANS 16:15B–16 CEV

Church members should participate together in God’s work, cooperating with each other.

Share together in both joy and suffering

Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. ROMANS 12:15 NET

Fellow believers may well be primarily in view here.

Love Each Other

Love each other as Jesus Christ loved us, even dying for us

[JESUS:] This is my command: *Love each other as I have loved you.* ¹³*The greatest love a person can show is to die for his friends.*

JOHN 15:12–13 NCV™

Love is expressed by loving actions

[JOHN, TO BELIEVERS:] *Now, suppose a person has enough to live on and notices another believer in need. How can God’s love be in that person if he doesn’t bother to help the other believer?* ¹⁸*Dear children, we must show love through actions that are sincere, not through empty words.* 1 JOHN 3:17–18 GW

Care for Each Other

Pray constantly for each other

Never stop praying, especially for others. Always pray by the power of the Spirit. Stay alert and keep praying for God’s people.

EPHESIANS 6:18 CEV

Encourage each other

You must encourage one another each day. And you must keep on while there is still a time that can be called “today.” HEBREWS 3:13A CEV

Help each other

[THE WRITER, TO BELIEVERS:] *Carry one another’s burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.* GALATIANS 6:2 NET

God is always fair. He will remember how you helped his people in the past and how you are still helping them. HEBREWS 6:10A CEV

For a church to function effectively it is critical that leaders know and do what is required of them. It is also important for church members to know what they should expect of leaders – and how to support them.

Why is it important to meet together with other Christians?

How do we benefit by participating and sharing in things with other believers?

The Sabbath

The Sabbath is holy – keep it holy by resting on it

[GOD, TO THE ISRAELITES:] *Remember the Sabbath day to set it apart as holy.* ⁹*For six days you may labor and do all your work,* ¹⁰*but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God; on it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, or your male servant, or your female servant, or your cattle, or the resident foreigner who is in your gates.* ¹¹*For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth and the sea and all that is in them, and he rested on the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and set it apart as holy.* EXODUS 20:8–11 NET

Israel was to observe the Sabbath as a sign of being God's people, identifying themselves with him by resting on the seventh day as he did. The necessity for Christians to observe the Sabbath has been the subject of debate.

But it is permissible to do good and necessary things on the Sabbath

Jesus left and went into one of the Jewish meeting places, ¹⁰where there was a man whose hand was crippled. Some Pharisees wanted to accuse Jesus of doing something wrong, and they asked him, "Is it right to heal someone on the Sabbath?" ¹¹Jesus answered, "If you had a sheep that fell into a ditch on the Sabbath, wouldn't you lift it out?" ¹²People are worth much more than sheep, and so it is right to do good on the Sabbath." ¹³Then Jesus told the man, "Hold out your hand." The man did, and it became as healthy as the other one.

MATTHEW 12:9–13 CEV

27. Worshiping God

Basics	8
How to Worship God	8
Worshiping Together	9
Offerings	10

Worship of God involves honoring him, recognizing his worthiness. As such it includes acknowledging God's divine characteristics and wonderful deeds.

Worship is done directly through praise and thanksgiving – and by making offerings to God (giving to him from what we have). It is carried out both in church groups and privately.

Note that serving God is also a form of worshiping him. As such the following chapter on serving God is also relevant to this chapter's theme.

Basics

We must worship God – and God alone

[GOD:] *Worship only me, the LORD your God!* EXODUS 23:25A CEV

Nebuchadnezzar said, “Praise the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. He sent his angel and saved his servants, who trusted him. *They disobeyed the king and risked their lives so that they would not have to honor or worship any god except their own God.* DANIEL 3:28 GW

Worship God for his greatness and deeds – and because he is God

[DAVID, TO GOD:] *All the nations, whom you created, will come and worship you, O Lord. They will honor your name.* ¹⁰*For you are great and do amazing things. You alone are God.* PSALMS 86:9–10 NET

Live righteously in order to acceptably worship God

[GOD, TO UNGODLY PEOPLE IN ISRAEL:] *You twist the truth and stomp on justice. ...* ²¹*I, the LORD, hate and despise your religious celebrations and your times of worship.* ²²*I won’t accept your offerings or animal sacrifices— not even your very best.* ²³*No more of your noisy songs! I won’t listen when you play your harps.* ²⁴*But let justice and fairness flow like a river that never runs dry.* AMOS 5:7B, 21–24 CEV

How to Worship God

Worship God in spirit

[JESUS:] But a time is coming — and now is here — when the *true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth*, for the Father seeks such people to be his worshipers. ²⁴*God is spirit, and the people who worship him must worship in spirit and truth.* JOHN 4:23–24 CEV

To worship “in spirit” is primarily an inward activity, rather than being centered on the performing of ceremonial acts (which was such a main part of OT worship). It involves our spirit – and thus our mind and will.

new covenant, sealed with my blood. Whenever you drink it, do so in memory of me.” 1 CORINTHIANS 11:23–25 GNT

The Lord’s Supper, spoken of here, is regularly practiced in churches. It symbolizes and remembers Jesus Christ’s death for us. The breaking of the bread symbolizes the breaking of his body, and the pouring out of the wine symbolizes the pouring out of his blood – for the forgiveness of our sins.

In the above passage, “This cup is the new covenant in my blood” (v. 25), speaks of Jesus Christ’s blood, shed in his death, introducing the new relationship – or covenant – between God and his people. In part at least this was achieved by his death bringing forgiveness for the sins of God’s people.

Confessing Jesus Christ

Confess (or acknowledge) Jesus Christ, before others

[JESUS:] But I tell you, the Son of Man will acknowledge before God’s angels everyone who *acknowledges me before people.* LUKE 12:8 ISV

The NT speaks of confessing or acknowledging Jesus Christ. Usually it is indicated or suggested that this is done in the presence of others. Confessing Jesus Christ is an expression of commitment to him, as Lord, and involves stating what one believes about him. It is often done formally at one’s baptism and in church with the recital of creeds or “confessions”. In addition, many Christians will experience times in which they should acknowledge Jesus Christ and their faith in him before unbelievers – often at the cost or risk of being persecuted.

Things to confess about Jesus Christ

For the Jewish leaders had already agreed that anyone who *confessed Jesus to be the Christ* would be put out of the synagogue. JOHN 9:22B NET

And everyone will *confess that Jesus Christ is Lord* and bring glory to God the Father. PHILIPPIANS 2:11 NCV™

If anyone *confesses that Jesus is the Son of God*, God resides in him and he in God. 1 JOHN 4:15 NET

Baptism

The Greek for “baptism” refers to washing in water.

God’s people are baptized in (or into) the “name” of Jesus

On hearing this, *they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus.*

ACTS 19:5 ISV

By being baptized in or into the “name” of Jesus Christ, a person declares their identification and relationship with Jesus Christ – and also their commitment to him.

In this identification with Christ, baptism points both to the death of our old self in Christ’s death and to being raised up in union with him to live a new spiritual life (cf. Romans 6:3–5).

Baptism signifies belief

But *when they believed what Philip was saying about God’s kingdom and about the name of Jesus Christ, they were all baptized.*

ACTS 8:12 CEV

Baptism is a declaration and confirmation of belief.

Baptism signifies the washing away of sins

[ANANIAS, TO SAUL:] Get up, *be baptized, and wash your sins away, trusting in him to save you.* ACTS 22:16B NCV™

This should not be interpreted to mean that baptism in itself brings the forgiveness of sin. Rather, the external washing in water is symbolic of one’s spiritual cleansing.

The Lord’s Supper

Observe the Lord’s Supper – in remembrance of Jesus and his death

[PAUL, TO BELIEVERS:] For I received from the Lord the teaching that I passed on to you: that *the Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took a piece of bread, ²⁴gave thanks to God, broke it, and said, “This is my body, which is for you. Do this in memory of me.” ²⁵In the same way, after the supper he took the cup and said, “This cup is God’s*

To begin with, our heart and/or conscience must be right before God. Then we must be honest and open in approaching God (to worship in “truth”, cf. John 4:23–24 above), and fully focused on God. Not least, we must worship by the Holy Spirit (cf. Philippians 3:3). This involves: being conscious of the Spirit; relying on the Spirit’s help to relate with God; and being open to the Spirit’s promptings.

Worship God with reverence and awe

[THE WRITER, TO BELIEVERS:] Let us be grateful and *worship God in a way that will please him, with reverence and awe; ²⁹because our God is indeed a destroying fire.* HEBREWS 12:28B–29 GNT

Worshiping Together

Join with fellow believers in worshiping God

Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people replied “Amen! Amen!” as they lifted their hands. *Then they bowed down and worshiped the LORD with their faces to the ground.* NEHEMIAH

8:6 NET

[A CALL TO FELLOW ISRAELITES:] *Come! Let’s bow down and worship! Let’s kneel before the LORD, our creator!* PSALMS 95:6 NET

Offer praise and thanksgiving together

They [Israelites] praised the LORD and gave thanks as they took turns singing: “The LORD is good! His faithful love for Israel will last forever.” Everyone started shouting and praising the LORD because work on the foundation of the temple had begun. EZRA 3:11 CEV

Pray together

They [the apostles] gathered frequently to pray as a group, together with the women and with Mary the mother of Jesus and with his brothers. ACTS 1:14 GNT

Offerings

We are also to worship God with offerings

He [God] is wonderful! Praise him and *bring an offering into his temple. Worship the Lord*, majestic and holy. 1 CHRONICLES 16:29 CEV

This implies that giving offerings (or gifts) to God is a part of worshipping him.

Give willingly

[PAUL, TO BELIEVERS:] *Each one of you should give just as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, because God loves a cheerful giver.* 2 CORINTHIANS 9:7 NET

Give generously to God and his work

[PAUL, TO THE CORINTHIAN BELIEVERS:] Therefore I thought it necessary to urge these brothers to go to you in advance and to arrange ahead of time *the generous contribution you had promised*, so this may be ready *as a generous gift and not as something you feel forced to do*. ⁶My point is this: The person who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and *the person who sows generously will also reap generously.* 2 CORINTHIANS 9:5–6 NET

Note that in v. 5 Paul is speaking of a gift towards the support of needy believers.

It is important for each Christian to understand all significant church practices. Prominent amongst these are baptism, the Lord's Supper and confessing Jesus Christ. Observing the Sabbath is a further significant practice, observed by God's people for thousands of years.

In your own words, explain what it means to worship God “in spirit and truth” (John 4:23–24)?

How can we worship God “with reverence and awe” (Heb 12:28)?

What do you do to worship God? Is there anything else that you should do?

Why is it important to give to God?

Is there any change you should make in how or what you give to God?

How do you serve God? What other work could you do for him?

How can we ensure our work will produce “the kind of fruit that will last” (John 15:16)?

What are the advantages of working with other believers in serving God?

Which gift of the Holy Spirit do you think you have? If you are not sure, how could you find out?

What should one do in seeking to be guided by God?

Being Guided By God

The topic of being guided by God is very important to serving God. For we need to understand his will in regard to how we should serve him.

God's guidance may come through such sources as: the Holy Spirit's promptings; an inner certainty (itself largely of the Holy Spirit); Scripture; circumstances; or advice from others. But God does not always guide his people by making them aware of his will. They may not even be aware of being guided by God, only realizing later that he did guide them.

The Bible actually says little about how we should find out God's guidance. But it does speak of how living a godly life and prayer are critical for being open to it.

In order to be guided by God, live a godly life

[GOD:] *If you put an end to oppression, to every gesture of contempt, and to every evil word; ¹⁰if you give food to the hungry and satisfy those who are in need, then the darkness around you will turn to the brightness of noon. ¹¹And I will always guide you and satisfy you with good things.* ISAIAH 58:9B–11A GNT

Pray, asking God to guide you (as in troubled times)

[DAVID, TO GOD:] *Indeed, you are my rock and my fortress. For the sake of your name, lead me and guide me.* PSALMS 31:3 GW

The lives of each of God's people ought to be devoted to serving him. As this chapter shows, in serving God we need to rely on him and make use of the extraordinary spiritual gifts that he gives his people.

Devotion to God's Service

Be devoted to God's work

Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your work in the Lord is never wasted. 1 CORINTHIANS 15:58B NCV™

Serve only God

Then Jesus said to him, “Go away, Satan! Because it is written, ‘You must worship the Lord your God and serve only him.’”

MATTHEW 4:10 ISV

Stop living for yourself so as to live for Jesus Christ

[JESUS:] *If anyone wants to become my follower, he must deny himself, take up his cross daily, and follow me.* LUKE 9:23B NET

We must deny ourselves – give up living for ourselves and what we want – and live for Christ instead, daily accepting the accompanying difficulties.

How to Serve God

Do quality work that bears “fruit” – “fruit” that will last

[JESUS, TO HIS DISCIPLES:] *And I gave you this work: to go and produce fruit, fruit that will last.* Then the Father will give you anything you ask for in my name. JOHN 15:16B NCV™

Here “fruit” likely refers to spiritual outcomes of quality work for God's kingdom.

Pray to God for help in the work

[THE BELIEVERS, PRAYING:] *Lord, listen to their threats! We are your servants. So make us brave enough to speak your message.* ³⁰*Show your mighty power, as we heal people and work miracles and wonders in the name of your holy Servant Jesus.* ³¹*After they had prayed, the meeting place shook. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and bravely spoke God's message.* ACTS 4:29–31 CEV

Do God's work with other believers

[PAUL, TO SYZYGUS:] *And, my true partner, I ask you to help them. These women have worked together with me and with Clement and with the others in spreading the good news.* PHILIPPIANS 4:3A CEV

Spiritual Gifts

God gives believers a spiritual gift, through the Holy Spirit

Something from the Spirit can be seen in each person, for the common good. ⁸*The Spirit gives one person the ability to speak with wisdom, and the same Spirit gives another the ability to speak with knowledge.* ⁹*The same Spirit gives faith to one person. And, to another, that one Spirit gives gifts of healing.* ¹⁰*The Spirit gives to another person the power to do miracles, to another the ability to prophesy. And he gives to another the ability to know the difference between good and evil spirits. The Spirit gives one person the ability to speak in different kinds of languages and to another the ability to interpret those languages.* 1 CORINTHIANS 12:7–10 NCV™

The abilities to speak with wisdom and knowledge (v. 8) likely refer respectively to: giving wise advice or insight; and conveying spiritual truths/knowledge. The ability to prophesy (v. 10) concerns speaking messages from God, such as telling of a future event or of God's will about a certain matter.

The ability to know the difference between spirits (v. 10) appears to be the ability to tell whether something, such as a prophecy or teaching, is prompted by the Holy Spirit or a demonic spirit. (More gifts are mentioned below.)

Use your spiritual gift to build up the church

It was he [Christ] who “gave gifts”; *he appointed some to be apostles, others to be prophets, others to be evangelists, others to be pastors and teachers.* ¹²*He did this to prepare all God's people for the work of Christian service, in order to build up the body of Christ.*

EPHESIANS 4:11–12 GNT
